#### **OBJECTIVES**

The communication training has the following main objectives:

- Exchange NEBs' experiences and good practices in devising communication strategies and implementing communication activities aimed at promoting equality, raising awareness and providing information on rights.
- gain practical knowledge and understanding of strategic issues surrounding communication in the field of equality and non-discrimination
- Reflect on how to involve and collaborate with stakeholders in the field of equality to combat underreporting and lack of awareness of people's rights.

#### **TARGET PARTICIPATION**

The communication training is aimed at equality bodies' staff members who have an interest and/or role in communication strategies and activities.

Training capacity: 45 participants with maximum 2 participants per Equinet member organisation and 1 for observer Equality Body.

#### **TRAINING APPROACH**

Practitioners working in the fields of equality and communication will deliver presentations in a plenary setting.

World café method will be used to generate ideas, facilitate the exchange of experiences, learning and good practices on specific issues and exploring action possibilities around real life situations. Participants will be split into small groups to discuss the issue at hand around their table. At regular intervals (every 20 minutes), participants move to a new table. Five questions tackling different key aspects of communication will structure and steer discussion and exchange during the exercise.







Members of the working group on communication strategies & practices will act as table hosts and will be entrusted with the task of capturing the flow of ideas emerging from the table discussion. The Equinet secretariat team will assist the table hosts and will act as timekeepers.

The workshops will be facilitated by a practitioner who is familiar with this training technique and the work of equality bodies. The workshop will start with an introductory discussion explaining of the training method and set exercises.

At the end of the session, the main ideas will be summarized in a plenary session and discussed by all participants.
