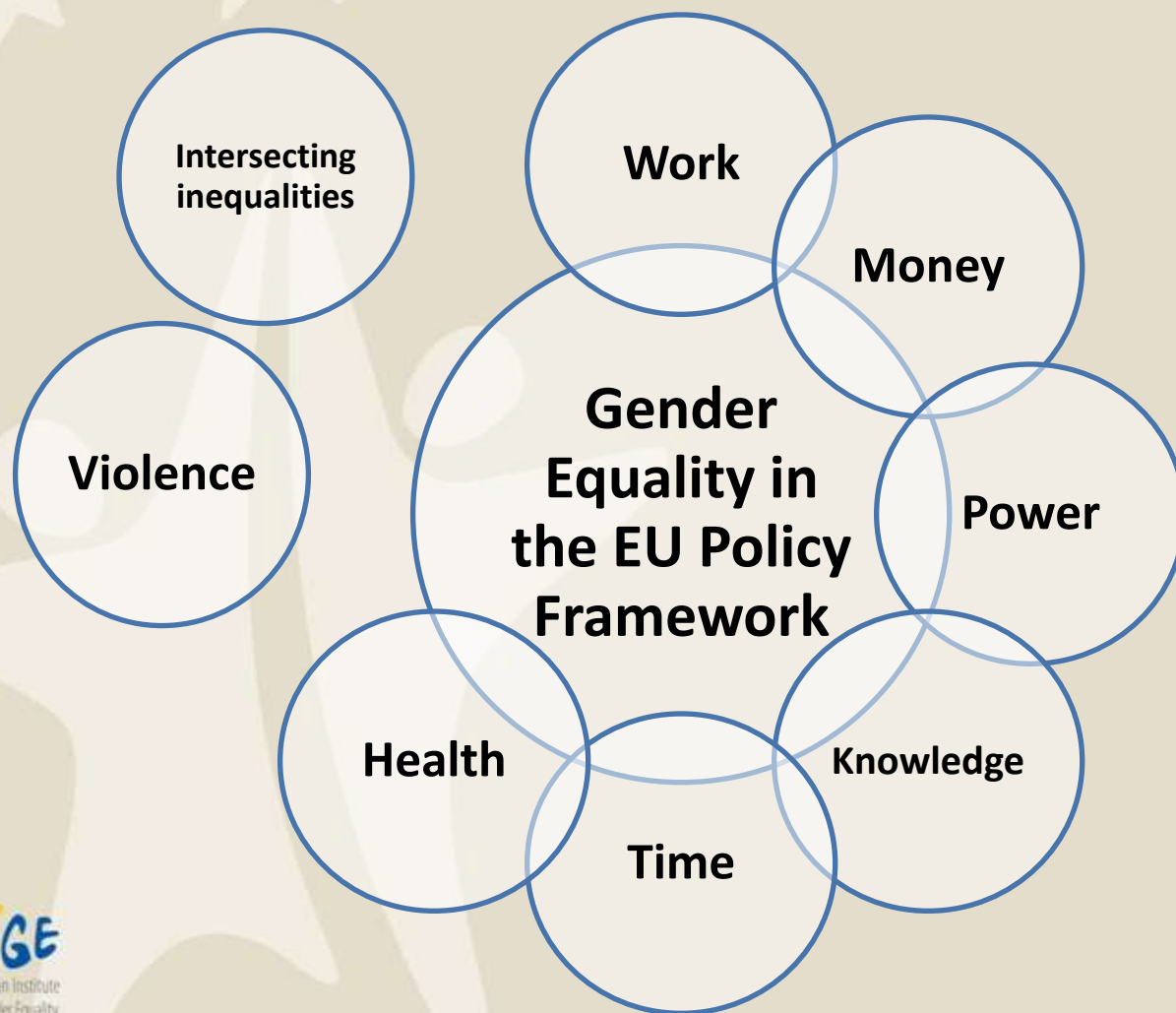

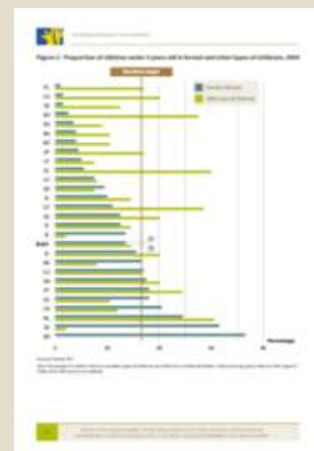

Gender training: Factors contributing to its effective implementation and challenges

'When it comes to gender training, bad training is often

Gender mainstreaming has been on the political agenda at international and European levels since 1995. Whereas it is a policy commitment for most EU Member States, responsible staff for its implementation often lacks gender

Gender training: Step-by-step approach to quality

- **What is gender training?** Gender training is a tool and a process meant to support policy makers in their effort to integrate gender considerations into all policies and programmes.

Good practices in gender training

Based on evidence gathered for EIGE's project on *Gender training in the EU: Mapping, research and stakeholders' engagement (2012-2013)*, this reference sheet presents some resources for gender training in Europe. It also provides some good practice examples in train the trainers and gender competence programmes in specific sectors.


Institutional Mechanisms – Beijing Platform for Action

The BPfA identified 3 strategic objectives:

- Create or strengthen national machineries and other governmental bodies
- Integrate gender perspectives in legislation, public policies, programmes and projects
- Generate and disseminate gender disaggregated data and information for planning and evaluation

Indicators prepared by Finnish Presidency

Finnish Presidency in 2006 prepared indicators for the follow-up of the BPfA on the critical area of institutional mechanisms for the advancement of women:

- Indicator 1. Status of governmental responsibility in promoting gender equality
- Indicator 2a. Personnel resources of the governmental gender equality body
- Indicator 2b. Personnel resources of the designated body or bodies for the promotion of equal treatment of women and men
-  Indicator 3. Gender mainstreaming

Indicators (prepared by Finnish Presidency, 2006)

- **Indicator 1:** Status of governmental responsibility in promoting gender equality
 - Existence of a governmental body for gender equality
 - Functions of the governmental body
 - Level of location of the governmental body
 - Status of responsibility at the governmental level
 - Consultation on evaluation of policies and adjustment of policies after consultation

- **Indicator 2a:** Personnel resources of the governmental gender equality body
- **Indicator 2b:** Personnel resources of the designated body or bodies for the promotion of equal treatment of women and men

Indicator 3: Gender mainstreaming

- Commitment of the government to the gender mainstreaming
- Structures of gender mainstreaming
- Gender impact assessment in drafting of laws

- Gender equality training
- Data collection (possible new indicator)
- Data dissemination (possible new indicator)

The aim and objectives of the study

- The aim is to produce a report on the current stage of implementation of the strategic objectives formulated in **area H of the BPfA: Institutional Mechanisms**, with a focus on national machineries and other governmental bodies responsible for gender equality, gender mainstreaming and collection and dissemination of sex-disaggregated data and information.
- The objectives:
 - *to develop an overview of the background situation on institutional mechanisms for gender equality, with an emphasis on existing national machineries and designated governmental bodies for gender equality, gender mainstreaming, and the collection and dissemination of sex-disaggregated information;*

The aim and objectives of the study

- The objectives (continued):
 - Will collect data on institutional mechanisms for the promotion of gender that will be based on and comparable to the methodology used by the Finnish Presidency (2006). Regarding objective H3 of the BPfA, a new methodological approach will be developed for data collection in the 27 EU Member States and Croatia for the existing mechanisms and state of play;
 - Will provide qualitative and quantitative analysis of the collected data
 - Will provide a review, analysis and expansion of the indicators proposed by the Finnish Presidency and adopted by the Council of the European Union in 2006 on the basis of the collected data and information;

The aim and objectives of the study

- The objectives (continued):
 - Will develop new indicator(s), including sub-indicators if necessary, that will facilitate the monitoring of progress in the implementation of objective H3 of the BPfA on the basis of the data and information collected;
 - A detailed report will be published in October, based on the background description and literature review, collected data, a review of existing indicators, descriptions of the proposed new indicators and conclusions;
 - Specific knowledge-based products will be available to facilitate the dissemination and accessibility of the results of the study in a concise and user-friendly way.

Methods of data collection

- Analysis of national documents and research materials
- Online survey of Commission's High Level Group on Gender Mainstreaming (high level representatives of governmental bodies working on gender equality and mainstreaming)
- Semi-structured interviews with women's NGOs in all 27 EU Member States and Croatia

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
