




Equinet Working Group Equality Law in Practice

Work on positive action


- > 3 WG meetings (2013-14)

Equinet Report on Positive Action


- 1. Legal framework: international & European legislation and CJEU case law

- 6. Case study of the use of positive action measures addressing religious and political discrimination in Northern Ireland






Equinet Report on Positive Action

Concluding observations:

- Prevalence of PA measures addressing gender inequalities, no examples on sexual orientation and religion and belief
- Complex and unclear rules and definitions
- Need for data to demonstrate need for action
- Importance of evaluating the measures
- Role of the state
- Need to be part of complex equality policies
- Voluntary approach vs. compulsory approach





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
