What is gender-based violence?

Violence directed against a person because of that person's gender (including gender identity/expression) or violence that affects persons of a particular gender disproportionately.



Survey of the Fundamental Rights Agency

1 in 3 women in the EU experienced physical and/or sexual violence since the age of 15

55% of women in the EU have experienced sexual harassment

5% of women in the EU have been raped

10% of women in the EU have experienced harassment through new technologies

Legal basis for EU action on gender equality

- Since 1957, the Treaty of the European Community provides a legal basis for legislation, policy and funding for gender equality.
- With the entry into force of the Treaty of the European Union, gender equality is a "fundamental value" (art.2 TUE) and an "objective" (art.3 TUE) of the EU.
- The Union is required to **promote equality between men** and women in all its activities (Art. 8) and to **combat** discrimination in defining and implementing its policies (Art. 10).



Legislation

- Directive 2006/54/EC on equal treatment;
- Directive 2011/36/EU on trafficking in human beings;
- Directive 2011/93/EU on combating the sexual abuse and sexual exploitation of children and child pornography;
- Directive 2011/99/EU on European Protection Orders;
- Directive 2012/29/EU establishing minimum standards on the rights, support and protection of victims of crime;
- Regulation (EU)606/2013 on mutual recognition of protection measures in civil matters, and;
- Communication COM(2013)833 final on the elimination of female genital mutilation.
