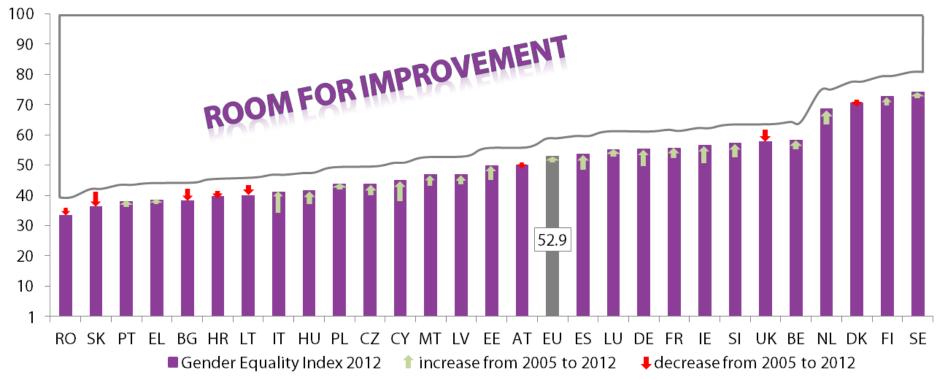

1 = no gender equality100 = complete equality

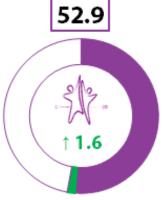
→ New edition of Gender Equality Index will be published autumn 2017

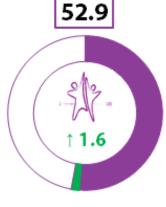


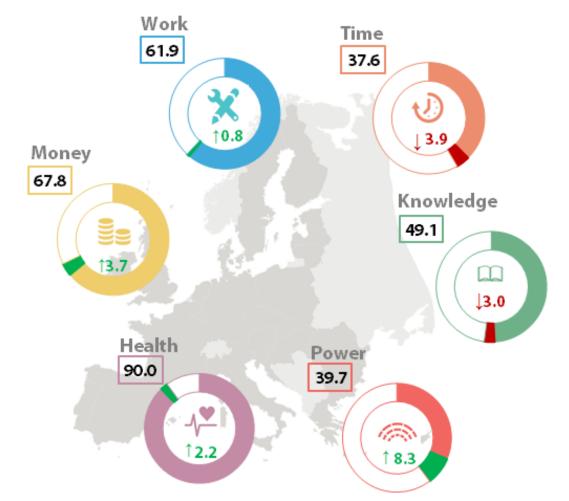


## The Gender Equality Index and it's domains EU-28, 2012

#### **GENDER EQUALITY INDEX**







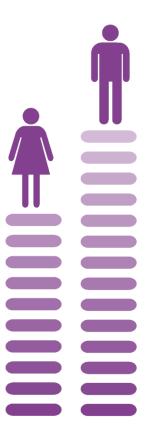






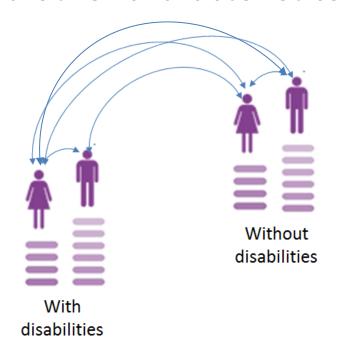


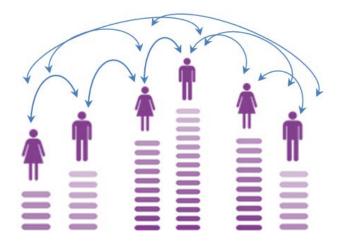
Gender Equality Index counts gender gaps adjusted for levels of achievement





# Measuring intersectional inequalities: Intersection of gender and other characteristics will be included to the Index





#### **Family type**

- 1. Single person
- Lone mother/father
- 3. Living in couple without children
- 4. Living in couple with children

#### Migrant bakcground

- National born
- Non-national born

#### **Disability**

- 1. With limitations in everyday life
- 2. No limitations in everyday life

#### Education

- 1. Low educated
- Medium educated
- 3. High educated

#### Age groups

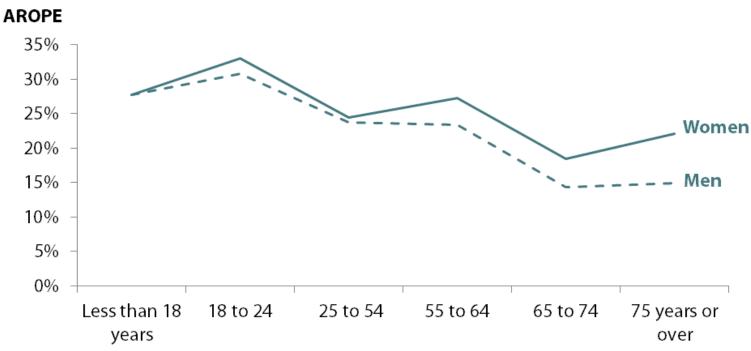
- 1. 15/16 24
- 2. 25 49
- 3. 50 64
- 4. 65 and older





### Intersection of age and gender

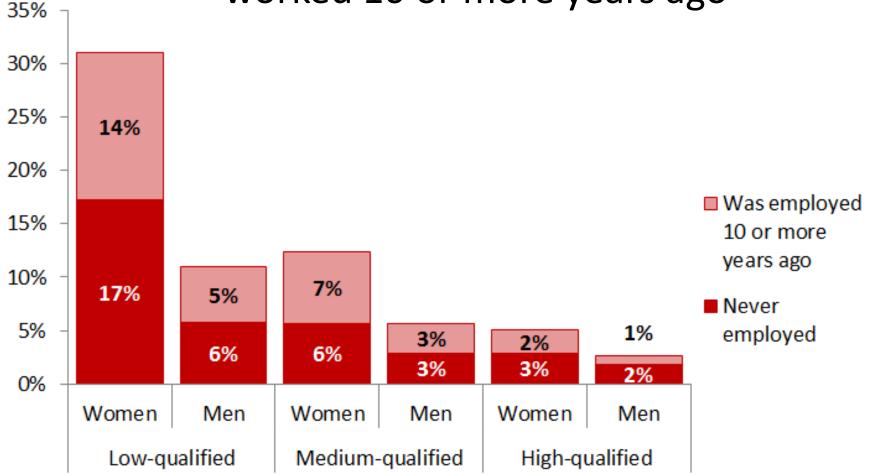
#### Poverty or social exclusion rate (AROPE) by age of women and men



The risk of poverty or social exclusion decreases with age for both women and men while gender differences increase in older age groups



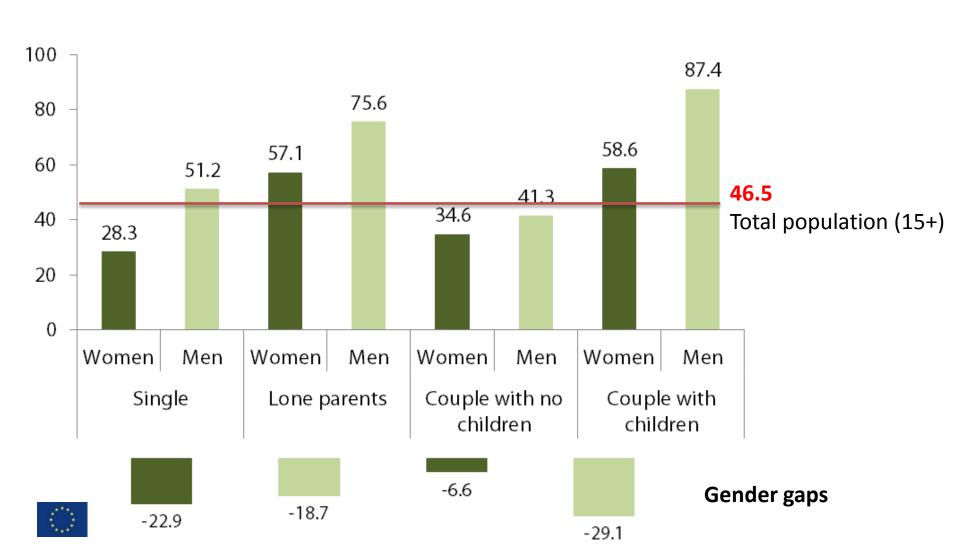
worked 10 or more years ago



Analysis of intersection of education and gender shows that low-educated women is a cultural risk group in the labour market

# To conclude

- Gender Equality Index 2017 will incorporate intersecting inequalities
- Index score (may be) reduced for those who have large intersectional inequalities
- Five areas of life from intersectional perspective will be analysed
  - Domains of work, money, health, time and knowledge
  - Analysis will reveale most disadvantaged groups in these areas and give policy pointers where to focus to reach the objectives in EU-28
