Slovak National Centre for Human Rights is a national institution for human rights protection and promotion and is accredited within the UN system. Mandate of the Centre is to operate comprehensively in the area of human rights and fundamental freedoms. Since 2004, the Centre's role is closely linked to Slovak antidiscrimination legislation, when the Centre was appointed as the only Slovak equality body, i. e. a body for evaluation of the observance of the principle of equal treatment under the Antidiscrimination Act.
