Equinet Members

- Network of national equality bodies (46 members from 34 European countries)
- Equality bodies on the basis of EU Equal Treatment Directives (2000/43/EC; 2004/113/EC; 2006/54/EC)
- Diversity among national equality bodies in terms of size, mandate, grounds, structure and experience





Equality body tools

- Mandated by EU to
 - "Provide independent assistance to victims"
 - "Conduct independent surveys"
 - "Publish independent reports and make recommendations"
- Promotional functions
- Quasi-judicial functions







Making Equality Legislation Work for Roma and Travellers (2010)

- Most equality body mandates cover discrimination against Roma and Travellers
- Mutual education and awareness raising:
 - platforms for dialogue and networks (Greek Ombudsman/Hungarian Equal Treatment Authority)
 - awareness of rights among Roma community; cultural sensitivity (Swedish Ombud)
 - Targeted information about rights (former French HALDE)
 - Capacity building of NEB staff (former Irish Equality Authority)
- Strategic litigation (high expense)
 - Capture systemic or institutional discrimination
- Monitoring
 - Research on levels of rights awareness and barriers faced by the communities
- Promote Equality
 - Use positive action measures or equality duties (where these exist)







Fighting Discrimination on the Ground of Race and Ethnic Origin (2016)

- In a context in which there is a prevalence and rise of
 - race discrimination
 - hate speech and hate crime
 - negative media coverage
 - negative political speech
 - negative public sentiment







Fighting Discrimination (2016) Cont.

- Roma in particularly vulnerable situation compared to other racial or ethnic minorities (17/19 NEBs report)
- Intersectional discrimination (Roma women and children in education, early/forced marriage, employment, access to services)
- Fields
 - Healthcare and social protection
 - Housing
 - Goods and services (harassment, discrimination, denial of boarding)
 - Education (access, segregation)
 - Employment (recruitment, working conditions, equal pay, unjustified dismissal, harassment)





Operational Platform for Roma Equality

- Platform stimulates cooperation among institutions, inter alia on
 - Access to justice and underreporting
 - Children's rights
 - Violence and early/forced marriage
 - Denial of boarding





OPRE Joint Statement on Evictions













- Used by platform members
- Signatories urge governments and competent regional and local authorities to inter alia:
- Raise victims' awareness of their rights and provide information in a language victims speak
- Make available free or low cost legal assistance and effective legal remedies
- Ensure that evictions are not triggered or justified by anti-Gypsyism and hate speech;
- To address the systemic factors that prevent Roma and Travellers from legalising their housing status and put them at risk of eviction.





Conclusions

- Keep closing gap between equality bodies and Roma and Traveller communities
 - Increase regional and local coverage of NEBs
 - Build capacity of NEBs (building trust based on mutual respect)
 - Ensure capacity for outreach activities (holistic and long term approach)
- Work with duty bearers (including politicians)
- Consider positive action measures
- All fields covered by Roma Integration Strategies equally important
- Ensure equality bodies are independent
