Gender Equality Index 2017: Progress at a snail's pace



NEWS ARTICLE

The updated Gender Equality Index shows
where Europe stands today. We are moving
forward but overall progress is very slow. The
EU's score is just four points higher than ten
years ago, now 66.2 out of 100. The top
performing country is Sweden with a score of
82.6, while Greece moved to the bottom with 50
points. The award for the most improved
country goes to Italy, which made a big leap and
gained 12.9 points to place itself at rank 14 on the ladder.







What happened afterwards?

- 492 website mentions of Index across media types (e.g. mainstream media, public institution websites, NGOs, news aggregators)
- 371 mainstream media mentions (almost 14% of EU population). 100% positive coverage
- Coverage in all EU Member **States**
- Most mainstream coverage was in Greece (131), Italy (44) and Sweden (40)

Gender Equality Index 2015: Finland

The Gender Equality Index is a unique measurement tool that synthesises the complexity of gender equality into a user-friendly and easy to understand measure. Based on the EU policy framework, it assists the monitoring of progress in gender equality across the European Union over time.

The Gender Equality Index 2015 measures how far (or close to) the EU and its Member States were from achieving gender equality in 2005, 2010 and 2012 (1). It provides results for each domain and subdomain. It also presents the first attempt to adulate a composite measure for indexe against women.

Progress in gender equality in Finland since 2005


