Quorum

31 Equinet Members attended the Annual General Meeting (AGM) 2022, among whom 6 were appointed as proxy to represent other members, giving a total of 37 voting Equinet Members represented at AGM 2022. Consequently, in accordance with the Equinet Statutes, the quorum for a valid Equinet Annual General Meeting was reached (at least half of the whole 47 Members should be represented at an AGM).

Decision making threshold

In line with the statutes of the organisation, the set validity threshold for the Equinet AGM is a simple majority of the effective members who are present or represented. This implies that 50 percent of Equinet Members present or represented +1 need to vote positively (at least 19 out of 37 in this case), in order for decisions to be adopted

Welcome and introduction

On 5 October 2022, Tena Šimonović Einwalter, Chair of the Equinet Board of Directors and Ombudswoman of Croatia, delivered a welcome address and declared the **seventeenth Equinet Annual General Meeting (AGM)** open at 09:10. The Equinet AGM was held in person, in Brussels, at the Pullman Hotel at Gare du Midi.

SESSION 1 – Equinet 2022 review

Report on Equinet Workplan 2022 and activities, Funding & Finance

On behalf of the Equinet Board, Equinet Co-Directors Anne Gaspard & Tamás Kádár gave a comprehensive report on Equinet activities in 2022. Rhoda Garland (Equinet Treasurer) introduced to the Members the overview of the financial situation for 2022, alongside the future Equinet budget 2023.

Q&A - Members' discussion

Equinet's board and secretariat were commended for the good administration of the budget and received suggestions on seeking political support for finding funding for non-EU members.

Voting

As foreseen in the AGM agenda and on the basis of voting documents previously sent to Equinet Members, Equinet Chair, Tena Šimonović Einwalter invited Equinet Members to cast their votes on the following documents:

SESSION 2: Looking forward - 2023 plans and Equinet governance

Equinet Strategic Plan 2023-26

Tena Šimonović Einwalter, Chair of Equinet Board and Valérie Fontaine, Equinet Board Member, proposed the new Equinet strategic plan and presented all strategic objectives of the Strategic Plan.

Q&A – Members' discussion

Members emphasized the importance of Equinet's membership engagement in 2023, and the support for peer exchange in matters of strategic and annual planning.

Equinet Work Plan 2023

Tena Šimonović Einwalter and Valérie Fontaine presented the Equinet 2023 Work Plan, including the main activities planned for the next year for each working group and cluster.

Q&A – Members' discussion

Members discussed challenges members may face when trying to engage in a large number of Equinet working activities and working structures. Equinet Secretariat addressed concerns clarifying working structures, pointing also to a reduced number of activities planned for 2023, and the development of an online platform for member engagement.

Voting

As foreseen in the AGM agenda and on the basis of voting documents previously sent to Equinet Members, Equinet Co-Director Anne Gaspard invited Equinet Members to cast their votes on the following documents:

- AMENDMENT TO STRATEGIC PLAN
 - The amendment to Strategic Plan was adopted unanimously (37 votes in favour) by the General Assembly of Equinet Members.
- STRATEGIC PLAN 2023-26
 - The Strategic Plan 2023-26 was adopted unanimously (37 votes in favour) by the General Assembly of Equinet Members.
- o WORK PLAN 2023
 - The Work Plan 2023 was adopted unanimously (37 votes in favour) by the General Assembly of Equinet Members.

Equinet Board Elections Procedure

Tamás Kádár, Equinet Co-director and Rainer Hiltunen, Board Member, jointly presented an amended proposal including small modifications to the Equinet Board Election Procedures, drafted by a taskforce made up of 3 board members in early 2022 (Rainer Hiltunen, Robert Gadja, Laurence Bond).

Q&A - Members' discussion

Members expressed support for the changes and suggested improving transparency of election process for the replacement of a vacated seat during the mandate of a Board member. The board will assess the need to further amend the election procedure to ensure that a clear procedure is established, a balance should be sought between need for transparency, on one hand, and the need for effectiveness, on the other hand.

Voting:

As foreseen in the AGM agenda and on the basis of voting documents previously sent to Equinet Members, Equinet Co-Director Anne Gaspard invited Equinet Members to cast their votes on board election procedure

• The amendment to board election procedure was adopted unanimously (37 votes in favour) by the General Assembly of Equinet Members.

SESSION 3: Equality in Europe - New developments and opportunities

This was the only session of the AGM open to external participants and speakers. The session provided an update on relevant new legislative and policy developments in the field of equality at the European level, with a focus on legislative standards for equality bodies, and an opportunity for exchanges between equality bodies, policymakers, legislators, and civil society actors on these developments and other pressing equality issues.

Q&A - Members' discussion

Members discussed the importance of the upcoming legislation on standards for equality bodies, of building support for its future adoption and citing concerns about any possible lobby against it. The EC representative welcomed and agreed with the importance of ensuring wide support to facilitate the legislative process towards adoption and noted that the proposed legislation will not allow for any possible regression on Equality Bodies' current powers.

SESSION 4: Promoting Standards for Equality Bodies

In this session Ferda Ataman, Independent Federal Anti-discrimination Commissioner and Head of the Federal Anti-Discrimination Agency of Germany and Jean O'Mahony, Irish Human Rights and Equality Commission reported on their national advocacy strategy.

Discussion Groups

Members divided in 3 groups to shares ideas and discuss potential strategy to implement at national level. All ideas and suggestions generated from the group discussions were conveyed to the Equinet Secretariat and incorporated into the guidelines for members on standards for Equality Bodies, as appropriate.

Final remarks and closing of the AGM

Tena Šimonović Einwalter, Chair of Equinet Executive Board, addressed closing remarks and thanked everyone for their active engagement during the AGM, noting that exchanged views and ideas were well noted especially on standards for equality bodies, and will be taken into account to guide Equinet's forthcoming work.
